
An elegant 'tin can' tea light holder STENCIL





How to use:

- 1) Measure the distance around your can (the circumference): Do this by wrapping a piece of paper around the can and marking the distance. Flatten out the paper and use a ruler to measure this distance. A tin of Heinz Baked Beans in the UK is 230mm for example.
- 2) Mark this value on the two rulers above and connect them with a vertical straight line. The red vertical line above shows you what you would do with a value of 230mm.
- 3) Lastly, draw a horizontal line at the point where your vertical line intersects the blue diagonal line (on the right), like the example horizontal red line above.
- 4) Cut along the horizontal and vertical lines you drew, and also the left and bottom lines (as indicated with the cut symbols).
- 5) Take the remaining rectangular piece of paper (the stencil) and wrap it around the can. Use a permanent marker to mark on the can the place where the diagonal lines meet the edge of the paper (the edge you created by drawing a horizontal line). Do this all the way around the can you should end up with 19 marks and 20 'gaps' between the marks.
